Stability, Success, Vision!

Dear Community Residents,

During the lean fiscal years, you were there to support us when our schools needed funding. During the 2020 budget vote, you voted to pierce the cap to pass the budget. Now, we are pleased to report that our district is financially stable and has received a generous increase in state aid funding. To show our appreciation to you, we are proposing a 2023-24 school budget of \$107,324,846 which funds all our innovative programs and initiatives and comes with a 0% tax levy increase.

Stability Is Key

- Our fund balance and reserve accounts have significantly improved over the past few years. Through consistent financial oversight, long-range planning and prudent spending, the district has gone from negative fund balance and reserve accounts to more than \$20 million.
- The New York State Comptroller's office reviewed the district's budget planning process for the 2023-24 school year and determined our revenue and expenditure projections are reasonable.
- The State Education Department fiscal monitor found the proposed 2023-24 budget to be balanced and consistent with the district's fiscal plan.

Success Is the Foundation for the Future

- Districtwide our scholar attendance rate has significantly improved.
- The State Education Department raised Milton L. Olive Middle School's designation from a school identified for Targeted Support and Improvement to a School in Good Standing.
- The new baseball field at Wyandanch Memorial High School and Milton L. Olive Middle School is a source of pride.
- Renovations to the Milton L. Olive Middle School library enhance scholars' literacy skills.
- New HVAC systems were installed at the elementary schools.

Vision Turns Goals Into Reality

Building upon the district's recent financial success and stability, the district will be able to do the following:

- Maintain funding for all current programs.
- Restore all teacher assistant positions previously eliminated.
- Add music and physical education teachers.
- Increase instructional staff districtwide including Academic Intervention Support services.
- Offer new athletic teams including intramural teams at the elementary level.

- Add a newly constructed barber shop classroom and instructor at the high school.
- Allocate funding for the creation of new scholar clubs and authentic learning experiences, including field trips.
- Continue repairs and renovations to district facilities as needed.

In addition to the proposed budget, there will be a second proposition to establish a \$15 million capital reserve fund. This reserve fund has no additional cost to taxpayers. The tax levy is still 0% even with the establishment of this capital reserve fund. Our capital reserve will help to offset future renovations and improvements to our schools as needed. The budget will be presented to voters at the 2023 Budget Vote and Board of Education Election on Tuesday, May 16, from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. at the district office. 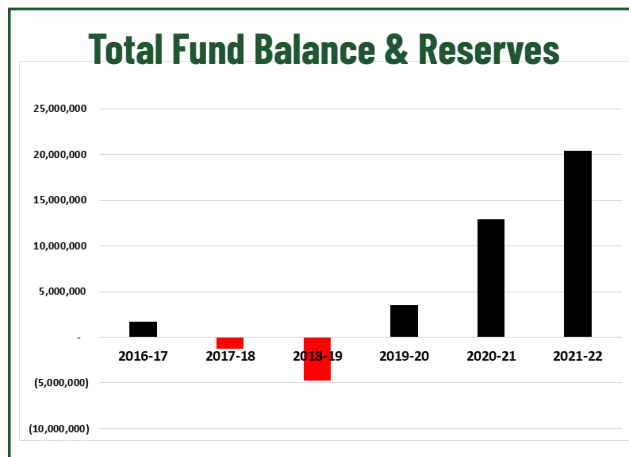

Overview of the Proposed 2023-2024 Budget

The Board of Education and administration have worked diligently to develop a proposed budget for the 2023-2024 school year that supports quality education and support programs for all scholars, while remaining fiscally responsible to taxpayers. The proposed 2023-2024 budget of \$107,324,846 expands programs and comes with a 0.00% tax levy increase, which is lower than the District's allowable tax levy increase.

NEW PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

The proposed 2023-2024 budget continues to ensure all scholars have every opportunity to receive the skills needed to celebrate diversity, succeed in college and their chosen careers and to become future leaders and advocates for those less fortunate.

NEW COURSE OFFERINGS

New course offerings for 2023-2024 are the result of collaboration among administrators, staff and scholars and focus on providing every scholar with multiple choices and pathways to achieve academic success.

WYANDANCH MEMORIAL HIGH SCHOOL

The courses below were created to be inclusive and celebratory of the scholars, while still maintaining a rigorous core curriculum.

MILTON L. OLIVE MIDDLE SCHOOL

Beginning with the 2023-2024 school year, middle school scholars will be grouped into three smaller learning communities to provide customized instruction and heighten engagement, excitement and involvement in learning, achievement and

college and career readiness. Scholars will be immersed in a three-year sequence track.

School of Career and Technical Education:

Scholars will select a track from one of the four majors: Culinary Arts, CIS: Hardware, CIS: Software and Business. Scholars enrolled in these prestigious career and technical education training programs will have firsthand immersive experiences.

School of Advanced and Accelerated Studies:

Scholars will pick a track from one of the three majors in the advanced fields of Liberal Arts, Public Health, and Business Management/Economics. Scholars graduating from this track will earn eight high school credits and complete seven NYS Regents.

School of Performing Arts: Scholars will pick a track from one of the four majors: Art, Chorus, Instruments and Theatre. Specialized educators will lead, guide and instruct scholars to produce and create.

New York State Education Department Raises Designation of Milton L. Olive Middle School

The Board of Education and administration are extremely proud to announce that the New York State Education Department has upgraded its previous designation of the Milton L. Olive Middle School from a school identified for Targeted Support and Improvement to a School in Good Standing. A continued commitment and determination to succeed on the part of scholars, staff and families has resulted in this significant improvement recognized by the state.

The NYSED now identifies a School in Good Standing as a school identified for Local Support and Improvement. Schools identified as LSI continue to have no regulatory requirements under the Every Student Succeeds Act, are not identified for additional support from NYSED and do not need to create an improvement plan.

The district announced the improved designation during the Board of

Education meeting on March 15, during which Milton L. Olive Middle School Principal Dr. Shannon Burton reviewed the middle school's plan to remain an LSI school.

"We must recognize the diligent efforts of the Milton L. Olive Middle School administration and staff who have worked tirelessly to ensure we received the LSI upgraded designation from the New York State Education Department," Superintendent of Schools Dr. Gina Talbert said. "It is excellent to see that the efforts have yielded a positive result, and I am excited to continue on the path of educational excellence at the middle school and within all the schools in the Wyandanch School District."

While the middle school has already implemented several programs which resulted in the upgraded NYSED designation, administrators and staff are introducing a new learning initiative to ensure continued improvement.

Beginning with the 2023-2024 school year, scholars will learn within three smaller learning communities. Each learning community will benefit from customized instruction designed to inspire learning, support achievement and prepare all scholars to succeed in college and careers.

The three learning communities will be the School of Career and Technical Education, the School of Performing Arts, and the School of Advanced and Accelerated Studies. In addition, several newly designed courses will be offered.

The New York State Education Department oversees the accountability of schools and districts throughout the state by measuring performance across subgroups. The law requires that states hold public schools accountable for how students achieve based on a list of specific indicators developed by parents, educators and experts in coordination with New York State.



IMPORTANT VOTER INFORMATION

TO VOTE YOU MUST BE:

- A United States citizen.
- At least 18 years of age.

- A resident of the school district for at least 30 days prior to the date of the election.
- Not otherwise ineligible to vote under the provisions of Section 5-106 of the Election Law.

TO VOTE YOU:

- DO NOT have to own property.

- DO NOT have to be a parent/guardian or have children in the school district.
